Item, 5th, I hereby constitute and appoint my loving friend, H. M. Balmann, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
