 Will and Testament in Manus and form following
 that is to say first that my Executor hereinafter named
 shall provide for my body a decent burial and pay
 all funeral expenses together with my just debts.
 I then I give and bequeath to my two Grand children
 Charles H. Young and Indianan Young Twenty
 Nine (29) Acres of land adjoining Harriette Everett
 Wife of Samuel H. Everett to them and their heirs
 forever when they shall arrive at the age of twenty
 One Year. And in case that one die before arriving
 at that age then to the survivor if living but in case they
 both die before arriving at the age of twenty one or after
 without leaving lawful issue of their bodies then it is
 my will that said Twenty nine acres of land shall
 go to my daughter Georganna Watson and to her
 heirs forever.

I then I give and devise to my daughter Georganna
 Watson All the residue of my estate both real personal
 and mixed to her and her heirs forever together with the
 Twenty nine acres of land given to my Grand children
 Charles H. Young and Indianan Young until they arrive
 at the age of twenty one years as provided in a former
 item in this my will.

And I do nominate constitute and appoint my friend
 J. Norman my sole executor of this my last will and
 Testament.

 last will as aforesaid and at the time of deponent's subscribing
 her name as an attesting witness thereto as aforesaid the said
 Harriette Watson was of sound mind and memory of full
 age to execute a will and was not under any restraint to
 the knowledge information or belief of this deponent.
