Fourth. - I hereby constitute, and appoint my trusty friend Mr. J. Norman my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament without bond according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other will and testament by me heretofore made, in witness whereof the said Warren W. White, do hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of October 1893.
