Fifth. All money, notes or other assets that I may own at the time of my death I wish to be equally divided between my two daughters, Mary A. Ange and Melissa F. Sasser taking from this my burial expenses, so far as it may go.

Sixth. I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons, C. H. Ange and A. T. Ange, my lawful executors (without bond) to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made.
