Johnson president of Johnson's Bible College in Lumberton - $\frac{1}{2}$ for the support of the public & aged and $\frac{1}{2}$ for the Johnson Bible College work. I hereby appoint Edward R. Ayers my executor or administrator without bond,

I, J. G. Ward, of the Town of Plymouth, in the County of Washington and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and declaring all former Wills and Testaments hitherto made by me void.

Item 1. I direct that my executor hereinbefore named shall bury me in a substantial coffin, but not an expensive one, I want the grave to be next to my wife's and, as soon as convenient, I want my executor to place our tombstone at the graves of my wife and myself, one tomb for both, or a double tomb.

Item 2. I give and bequeath to my niece Elizabeth Blane Skinner, and to my nephews, William T. Ward, each the sum of One Dollar, to be theirs absolutely.

Item 3. I give and bequeath to my maid, Mary Stalter, of Plymouth N.C., the small Day Bed and bedding of which I inherited from my brother's estate, and \$5.00 each week for ten weeks, for waiting on my niece Mrs. Elizabeth Blane Skinner, and for her faithfulness to me since she has been in my employ, to be hers absolutely.

Item 4. I give and bequeath to my niece, Elizabeth Blane Skinner, my automobile, my Family Bible and all of my personal property of any description used about my house and including the contents of the outhouse, to be hers absolutely.

Item 5. I hereby constitute and appoint my said niece, Elizabeth Blane Skinner, my lawful Executor, to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made.

The said Elizabeth Blane Skinner, herein appointed Executor to serve without bond.
