

North Carolina, Washington County.

I, James J. Balman, Esq., of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

Fifth. My executors hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the worth of himself and my relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate;

Second. I give and bequeath to each of my children, Benjamin S., Roy B., Sallie G., I. Bruce Thomas C., James J. Jr., Daniel and Robert L., the sum of \$5, to be paid by my executors, out of the moneys belonging to my estate, within eighty days from the date of my death.

Sixth. I give and devise to my beloved wife, Ida S., the following tracts of land in fee simple: (1) that certain tract of land, known as my "Old place," lying on the south side of the public road leading to Lumberton, and beginning at the foot of the Hiley Spurill Road and running easterly along said public road to the canal near the fork of the "Old Swamp Road"; thence southerly along said canal to the mouth thereof and continuing on to the Holmes land; thence westerly and northerly along the Holmes land to the beginning containing about thirty acres, and being the land conveyed to me by Isaac B. Balman and wife in 1872; (2) another tract of land which I purchased from David B. Ambrose and wife containing two acres, more or less; (3) another tract of land lying at fork of the "Old Swamp Road" and known as the school ground which I purchased from Louisa Holmes and E. Dunston, containing about one half of an acre; (4) another tract of land lying on the south side of the public road leading to Lumberton and the east side of the "Old Swamp Road," beginning at the fork of the said swamp road and running thence easterly along the public road to the Johnson Spurill line, a ditch; thence southerly along said Spurill line to the David B. Ambrose line; thence along said Ambrose line westerly to the "Old Swamp Road"; thence northerly along said swamp road and the old school ground line to the beginning containing about twenty-five acres, and being a tract of land which I purchased from Isaac B. Balman and wife.

Fourth. I give and devise to my beloved wife, Ida S., all my right title and interest in and to the entire tract of land on which I now reside, containing about 180 acres, for her

natural life, said tract being willed to me by my father, Isaac B. Balman.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Ida S., all of my household and kitchen furniture, money, personal property and all other property and assets not otherwise herein disposed of. Provided - That she shall pay to my son, Robert, \$200 for his education, within four years from the date of my death.

Sixth. I give and devise to my children, Benjamin S., Roy B., Sallie G., I. Bruce, Thomas C., James J. Jr., Daniel and Robert L., the entire tract of land on which I now reside, subject to the natural life estate of my wife, Ida S., as devised in item 4 of this, my will.

Seventh. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife,

Ida S., my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause hereof - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made.
