(1) I give to my loving wife, Christiana Best, all of my property that may occur at the time of my death consisting of both real and personal property for her natural life.

(2) I give to my son, William Best, Sr., for his natural life, beginning at the death of my wife Christiana Best, the following lands: Beginning at an iron post on the North side of my land and running in a southerly direction to a fence and along the fence to a pine in the dismal. After the death of my son William Best, Sr., I give and devise the above described lands to William Best Jr., in fee simple.

(3) The balance of the land which I now own and from which the land in item two is taken, I give to my daughter Annie Blount in fee simple after the death of my wife Christiana Best, providing however, that my daughter Annie Blount pays to my daughter Delta Roseau the sum of Two hundred Dollars, and to Nelsie Best, Christian Best and Little Norman the sum of One hundred Dollars to be equally divided between them.

I hereby appoint my son-in-law, Edward Blount, my administrator to carry out my intentions in this my last will and testament.
