

The Last Will and Testament of Mrs. Sallie Brinkley.

piano, which is now in my room, the electric lamp, which is now in my room.

Third. I give to my devoted niece, Mrs. Louise Peal, my wardrobe and curtains, except
my blue and pink bed jacket, which I desire to give to Lucy Glass, my large grip also
to Mrs. Louise Peal.

Fourth. I give to Mary Douglass my blue robe and pearls.

Fifth. I give to Francis Steiman my small grip and curtains.

Sixth. I give to Mrs. Lillian Steiman my gold watch.

Seventh. I give to the County Home, where I have been living recently, the bed
which is now in my room.

Eighth. I give to my faithful friend Dr. T. L. Gray all the rest of my personal
property of every kind and description.

Ninth. I hereby name and designate Dr. T. L. Gray my lawful executor to carry
out the provisions of this my last will and testament.
