I H. C. Chaplin, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First My executors hereinafter named, shall give any body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts if any out of the first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second I give and devise to my beloved wife Betty Chaplin so long as she remains my widow unmarried, all of the tract of land where I now live including all the houses all the land in cultivation and all the wood land to use for her support as long as she remains unmarried after my death.

Third I give and devise to my daughter Beatrice Ambrose and her heirs in full simple subject to the rights of my wife, as described above, a tract of land in Scruffmong Township Washington County adjoining the lands of Ida L. Edwards, and others containing twenty acres more or less, Beginning at a iron stake in the middle of the branch in H. H. Spruill's line at Ida L. Edwards corner, running eastwardly along H. H. Spruill's line to a iron stake directly opposite the line now in H. C. Chaplin's field, thence southwardly along said line now and beyond the line now running the same direction to R. Alexander's line, thence westwardly along said line to Ida L. Edwards line thence northwardly along said line to first station.

Fourth I give and devise to my son J. C. Chaplin and my daughter Hale Peniston and their heirs in full simple subject to the rights of my wife as stated above, all the remainder of my home tract of land containing fifteen acres more or less, Beginning at a iron stake in H. H. Spruill's line at Beatrice Ambrose's corner running eastwardly along said line to dividing line between H. H. Spruill and H. C. Chaplin, thence southwardly along said line to A. Alexander's line, thence westwardly along said line to Beatrice Ambrose's line, thence northwardly along said line to the first station.

Fifth I give and bequeath to my Grandson Howard Ansley Two Hundred Dollars in cash.

Sixth My will and desire is that the residue of my estate (if any) after taking out the devises and legacies above mentioned,

shall be given to my beloved wife Betty Chaplin.

Seventh I hereby constitute and appoint my truly friend Julius F. Snell my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made.
