Item 3. Item 4. At my wife's death or the termination of her widowhood I will that all real estate shall be equally divided amongst or between my children then living.

Item 5. I will that my beloved wife Eliza L. Freeman is hereby appointed by me guardian for my children during her life time or widowhood without bond and shall not be required to account to any court for funds or money entrusted to her care unless she marries.
