this my last will and testament:

First. My executors, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial,
suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral
expenses, together with all my just debt, out of the funds money which
may come into their hands belonging to my estate.

Second. I give and devise to my sister, Louisia Heyman, the two
lots I own in West Rogers, lying on the East side of road leading from
Rogers to Young School House, known as lots nos. 6 and 7, as designated
in two deeds from John L. Rogers Lumber Co. to L. G. Garrett, as recorded
in Reg. Deeds office Washington County, in Book #42, page 26, and the
other in Book #47, page 323, in few simple forms.

Third. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter, Annie Copfield,
daughter of Lucinda Garrett, the lot designated as no. 5, adjoining the
lots designated in second item of this will, referred to in deed from
Geo. L. Rogers Lumber Co., to L. G. Garrett recorded in Reg. Deeds office
Washington County, in Book #47, page 323; Provided, that the said Annie
Copfield should return to Washington County and build an home before
January 1st, 1934, otherwise this lot shall revert to the said Louisia Heyman
and her heirs in few simple forms.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my said sister, Louisia Heyman,
all other property of which I may die possessed, both real and
personal, to dispose of as she deems proper.

Fifth. I hereby constitute and appoint my said sister, Louisia
Heyman, my lawful executrix (without bond) to all intents and purposes,
to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent
and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof hereby
revising and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by
me hitherto made.
