First, My executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second, I give and devise to my son, Irving Harrell and his heirs in fee simple, the house and lot located on each side of East Main Street in the town of Plymouth, N.C., which I bought of S. B. Newman, and where I now reside, together with all chattel and other personal property of which I may die possessed.

Third, I hereby constitute and appoint my said son, Irving Harrell, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, without bond - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof, I, the said Berry Harrell, do hereunto set my hand and seal, this 21st day of May, 1936.
