Eighth. I give and bequeath to my daughter Selma Tarkenton all and whatever portion of the Star Risk Insurance that is due me at the time of my death on the life of my son Haywood Tarkenton. Also I give and bequeath to my said daughter Selma Tarkenton the burial insurance I hold in the Metropolitan Insurance Company. Also all money that I may have in Banks or otherwise, together with all household and kitchen furniture, and all other property of any description of which I die possessed.

Ninth. I hereby constitute and appoint my daughter Selma Tarkenton my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament without bond.
