Also I give and bequeath to my said daughter Selma Tarkenton the burial insurance I hold in the Metropolitan Insurance Company. Also all money that I may have in Banks or otherwise, together with all household and kitchen furniture, and all other property of any description of which I am possessed.

Ninth. I hereby constitute and appoint my daughter Selma Tarkenton my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament without bond.
