Haral of Washington N.C. executor to this will, without bond, vesting him with power to convert any and all forms of property that I may own at my death into cash or its equivalent and advising that he do so to the end that the distributions hereinafter set out may be conveniently and accountably made; and requiring that he first pay all just debts and funeral expenses and expenses of administration of his trust.
