

North Carolina, Washington County.

I, Laura Tiliton, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First. My executors, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate;

Second. I give and devise to my son, Rufus Tiliton, during the term of his natural life, and then to his children, in for ample, the tract of land on which I now reside, containing ten (10) acres more or less; also that certain tract of land in Plymouth Township, Washington County, beginning at intersection of Robelton's lead ditch, running through his field with the Little ditch (running northwardly and southwardly, across said field, or part of way); thence with said small ditch northwardly and southwardly in a southwardly direction to M. J. Normans corner; thence with Normans line to the Hollos line; thence northwardly with Hollos line to the Allen and Moore line, ditch, the beginning, containing 18 acres, more or less. For more full description see deed from R. H. Tiliton and wife, and L. A. Real and wife to Laura Tiliton, dated October 27th, 1922, and recorded in Book # 82, page 165, Registry of Deeds office Washington County, as to both tracts. It is my will that at my death my said son shall have such stock and farming implements as are to be found upon said farm, or farms.

Third. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Myrtle Real, any money or securities that I may die possessed of, including such sum as may be owing me by her husband, L. A. Real, for his only use during the term of his natural life, and at his death the remainder to go to her children.

Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint my son, Rufus Tiliton, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, (without bond), according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made,
