

North Carolina, Washington County.

I, Lama Teltun, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First. My executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the just moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second. I give and devise to my son, Rufus Teltun, during the term of his natural life, and then to his children, in fee simple, the tract of land on which I now reside, containing ten (10) acres more or less; also that certain tract of land in Plymouth Township, Washington County, beginning at intersection of Robertson's lead ditch, running through his field with the little ditch (running northwardly and southwardly across said field, or part of way); thence with said small ditch northwardly and southwardly in a southwesterly direction to M. J. Norman's corner; thence with Norman's line to the Wolfe line; thence northwardly with Wolfe's line to the Allen and Moore line, ditch, the beginning, containing 18 acres, more or less. For more full description see deed from R. H. Teltun and wife and L. A. Peal and wife to Lama Teltun, dated October 27th, 1922, and recorded in Book 782, page 165, Register of deeds office Washington County, as to both tracts. It is my will that at my death my said son shall have such stock and farming implements as are to be found upon said farm, or farms.

Third. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Myrtle Peal, any money or securities that I may die possessed of, including such sum as may be owing me by her husband, L. A. Peal, for his only use during the term of her natural life, and at her death the remainder to go to her children.

Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint my son, Rufus Teltun, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, (without bond), according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made,
