Second. I give my said wife Ella L. Morris one half interest
in a store and lot, it being in Pine Tree Beaufort County, N.C. It
being the store and lot that F. L. Morris and J. A. Morris bought
from Lucy Parker.

Third. I will to my wife Ella L. Morris my interest in
all the land in Washington County, N.C. and Beaufort County, N.C.
and Beaufort County, N.C. which H. A. Morris and Salter Ann Morris
his wife, died seized and possessed of. Except the Goodman Swamp
or the Sogum and Carr Damal, As long as she remains my
widow. Then it goes to my children, Edward H. Morris, Sarah G.
Morris and Albert Fred Morris.

Fourth. I, John A. Morris bequeath to my youngest son Albert
Fred Morris one house and lot being in Pine Tree Beaufort
County N.C. to have and to hold for his only use. Except a life right
in it for my wife, Ella L. Morris.

Fifth. I bequeath to my oldest son Edward Russell Morris
one town lot in Washington Heights near the city of Washington,
N.C. Beaufort County. Also six shares in stocks in the Washington
Heights property. except a life right in it for my wife Ella L. Morris.

Sixth. I, John A. Morris, bequeath to my daughter Sarah
G. Morris two share in the Imperial Mattress Factory in the
Washington Heights Property and also one share in the Prepared Stock
which price not less than seven per cent.
