Seventh; I give, bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Martha during the term of her life all the Real estate of which I die possessed, and all of my personal property not heretofore disposed of she is to have and to use as she may see fit, or to dispose of the same if she shall think proper.

Eighth; I give, bequeath and devise unto my son Bruce Patrick all of my real estate of whatever nature, after the death of my wife, and subject to the provisions heretofore made in reference to her.

Ninth; I give and bequeath unto Emma Patrick any and all personal property of my estate which shall remain after the death of my wife.

Tenth; I hereby constitute and appoint my son Bruce Patrick my lawful executor, to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament.

I hereby constitute and appoint my son, Joseph A. Snell my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true meaning of each clause hereof, hereby declaring all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me utterly void.
