Third. I give and devise to Mary Spruill one lot of land bounded
as follows: beginning at public road leading to Plymouth with
Sam Burnells corner running with Sam Burnells line towards
Emby creek 100 yards then running back east course 100 yards to
Martha Rhodes corner thence running southward course with Martha
Rhodes line 100 yards to main road thence running with main road
to Sam Burnells line the beginning.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all of my household
and kitchen furniture of all descriptions also our cook and law appt
whilst our open buggy all the rest on hand at time of my death
also all provisions, also our mule name Dick also all other farming
implements.

Fifth. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife my
lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last
will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the
same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and de-
claring utterly void all other wills and Testaments by me hereto-
made.
