on which she died, subject to the life estate of my said wife,
as devised in a former item in this my will, to have and
to hold to them in fee simple.

Fifth, I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved
wife, Annie Lee Roberson, my lawful executor to all
intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and
testament according to the true intent and meaning of
the same, and every part and clause thereof hereby
revoaking and declaring utterly void all other wills and
testaments by me heretofore made.
