I, H. H. Robinson, being of sound mind, and realizing the uncertainty of this earthly existence, do hereby make and declare this to be my last will and testament, thereby revoking all wills heretofore by me made.

(First)

I request that my executor, hereinafter named, shall pay all of my just debts out of the moneys that might come into his hands from my estate and give my body a decent burial.

(Second)

I give, devise and bequeath to my wife, Della Robinson, all my right title and interest in that certain tract of land located in Lees Mills Township and known as the E. F. Hassell estate; which said land is located about $\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Poplar, N. C. on what is known as the "Cedar Woods" road containing about 122 acres in all, and my estate in said land consisting of about $\frac{13}{18}$ of the whole tract.

(Third)

I give, devise and bequeath unto my wife, Della Robinson, all other real estate that I now own or may hereafter become into possession of, and all personal property that I now own or may hereafter may become in possession of, including all household and kitchen furniture.

(Fourth)

I hereby appoint my wife, Della Robinson, my executor to execute this, my last will and testament, to serve without bond.
