First: My executors hereinafter named shall give my body a decent and suitable burial and shall pay the costs and expenses of the same out of the first money coming into their hands belonging to my estate, together with any other just debts which I may owe at the time of my death.

Second: I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughters Alberta Swain and Annie May Swain any and all chattel property which I may own at the time of my death, the same consisting of wearing apparel, household and kitchen furniture, team farming implements, crop and provisions, money and any and all other personal property which I may leave at the time of my death, the same to be equally divided between them share and share alike & make this disposition of my personal property for the reason that my said two daughters have constantly remained with me and helped to take care of me and I feel like they have been of great help to me in accumulating such personal property as I may own at the time of my death.

Third: I hereby nominate and appoint my daughter, Alberta, as executor of this my last will and Testament with power and authority to execute the same according to the true intent and meaning of the same, hereby revoking and declaring utterly null and void any and all other wills and Testaments by me hitherto made.

In witness whereof, I, the said Humpenny Swain, a widow, have hereunto set my hand and seal, this the 3d day of October, 1923.
