That I, R. S. Swain of the state and county aforesaid being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my existence do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, viz:

Item 1: Excepting therefrom four acres of land mentioned in item 2, I give and bequeath to my son L. S. Swain and Nancy Swain, widow of my deceased son James Swain, 26 acres of land, known as the Thomas Swain tract, provided however, that the said L. S. Swain shall pay to my daughter Jennie, the sum of \$200.00 and said Nancy shall pay to my daughter Leona May, the sum of \$200.00.

Item 2: I give to my sons Bopal Lee and John Lafayette Swain, four acres of land which shall include the dwelling and out houses of that certain tract of land known as the Thomas Swain tract where I now reside, also all of that tract of land known as the Jake Field except that portion formerly conveyed to my son Joseph Swain, together with all of my personal property of every kind and description, excepting therefrom a sufficient amount to pay all my just debts to whomsoever owed and burial expenses.

Item 3: I hereby appoint and designate my trusty friend W. M. Bateman my sole executor to this my last will and testament to all intents and purposes hereby revoking all other wills hitherto made by me and do hereby declare them to be utterly void.
