First: That my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of the money that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my Estate.

(1st) I give and devise to my son A J Spruill thirty dollars and so'd

(2) I give and devise to my daughter Indiana Sawyer thirty dollars in Gold.

(3rd) I give and devise to my son W L Spruill 28½ acres of land in front where I now live bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the public road and running the various courses of the public road to J. W Spruill's line thence running along J. W Spruill's + W. W Spruill's line to the road that leads from the mountain house where now the said W W Spruill lives thence running northwardly along said road and Matilda Spruill's line to the first station and 3 acres of land bounded as follows. Beginning in W W Spruill's line thence running northwardly along the road in front of A J Spruill land ditch thence eastwardly to A J Spruill's line thence south along A J Spruill's line to E R Spruill's line thence running along E R Spruill's line to W W Spruill's line thence westwardly along W W Spruill's line to the first station

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend J J Spear my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof I hereby revoking and declaring entirely void all other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.

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
