I, W. H. Ward, M.H., of the town of Plymouth in the county of Washington and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, do make and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and declaring all former wills and codicils hereto before made by me void.

(1) I direct that trustee hereinafter named shall give my body a decent burial and erect a suitable marker or monument at my grave, and my trustee shall be conservative in creating these expenses, and the same shall be paid out of the first money coming into the hands of my trustee.

(2) I give and bequeath to my niece, Elizabeth Blanc Wimmen, and to my nephew, William Thaddeus Ward, children of my brother, George Ward, each the sum of One Dollar to be theirs absolutely.

(3) I give and bequeath to William Ward Owens, son of L. L. Owens, deceased, of Plymouth, N.C., my gold watch, to be his absolutely.

(4) I give and bequeath to my friend Ed Shiles of Bertie County, my globe covered clock, usually kept on the mantle in my office, to be his absolutely.

(5) I give and bequeath to my life long friend, Mr. J. E. Smithwick, who has been so kind to me when sick, all of my medical Books, Instruments, Appliances, medicines and office equipment, to be his absolutely.

(6) All of my other personal property used about my house, including automobile, and not hereinbefore bequeathed, exclusive of money, stocks, bonds and securities as well as evidences of debt, I give and bequeath to my brother, Johnson S. Ward, to be his absolutely.

(7) All of my money, bonds, stocks, securities and other evidences of debt and personal property, not hereinbefore bequeathed, owned by me at the time of my death, I give and bequeath unto the Branch Banking and Trust Company of Wilson, North Carolina, in trust for the following purposes, viz:-

To be invested by it in safe, interest bearing securities, and the net income therefrom I direct shall be paid to my brother, Johnson S. Ward, for his own use and support; and I further authorize my said trustee, if in its discretion the same be necessary, to use such portion of the principal as may be necessary for the support

and comfort of my said brother, giving unto my said trustee exclusive and sole discretion as to whether or not it is necessary to expend any part of the principal for the support and comfort of my said brother, I direct that this trust shall run for the period of the natural life of my said brother, and as soon after his death as is practicable. I direct that my said trustee shall convert all investments into money and pay over to my niece, Elizabeth Blanc Wimmen, of Arlington, New Jersey, one-half thereof, to be hers absolutely, the other one-half of my estate I direct shall be paid to the Rt. Rev. Bishop Harst or his successor and the proper authorities of the Diocese of East Carolina, in trust, the interest of said one-half to be applied by them for the up-keep of the Church and grounds of Grace Church and other property owned by Grace Church in Plymouth, N.C.

I direct that my farm land, wheresoever situate, shall be sold whenever it is to the best interest of my estate and the proceeds therefrom be invested in the best interest bearing securities, the net income and the principal to be disposed of as directed in item 7 above.

I nominate, constitute and appoint the Branch Banking & Trust Company of Wilson, North Carolina, to be my trustee of this my Last Will and Testament; and it is my desire that my trustee shall keep a clear, concise and separate record of all transactions of the estate and the trusts herein created, which records shall at all times be subject to the free inspection of the heirs under the will or the beneficiaries under the trusts above named, and trustee shall receive as compensation the usual commissions allowed by law.

5th. I name and declare my wife Ada Shiles, as executrix of this will, without bond to see that it be executed to all intent and purposes.

Having made and declared the foregoing to be my last Will and Testament, I hereby revoke and declare void any other will or paper writing heretofore made.
