I give devise & bequeath to my beloved son Charley D. White his heirs & assigns forever. The home tract of land where we now live

And I do nominate constitute and my said son J. C. White sole administrator of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all and every other will or wills at any time heretofore made by me and do declare this to be my last will and testament.
