of the province of North Carolina and County of Wayne
Planter, being of perfect mind and memory, make
this my last will and Testament, first I desire
to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion
of my executor, my Temporal Estate first I give
and bequeath to my beloved son Shadrach Boyet
a Piece of Land, Beginning at a white oak and down the
Branch to the Puckhosen to the line and to the Beginning
I give & bequeath to my beloved son Amos Boyet
a Piece of Land, which was called Nichols Land
the Land which is on the East side of the said Branch
in that Tract to him I give and bequeath to my son
and I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife for life
Time my estate to maintain her on, and after her
Decease, my hole and sole estate to my beloved son
Thomas Boyet, I constitute and appoint my beloved son Thomas
Boyet and Amos Boyet my hole and sole executor, of this
my last will and Testament, and I hereby utterly revoke
all other and Decemnull all former wills & bequeaths by

by me heretofore in any wise left or made.
Declaring and confirming, this and no other to be
my last will & Testament, as witness whereof
I hereunto set my hand and seal this 3rd day
of September 1726

23) The eight day of December one thousand seven
hundred and eighty six I James Bradbury of
the County of Wayne and State of No Carolina Being
of perfect mind and memory, but remembering
the mortality of my body, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner &
form following

First, I bind to my beloved wife my whole estate
Real and Personal during her Natural life

Item I Bequeath to my son Jacob Bradbury five shillings

Item I give to my daughter Hannah Better five shillings

Item I Bequeath to my son George Bradbury Twenty five

Pounds specie

Item I give to my daughter Mary Bell Twenty Pounds

Item I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Bell five Pounds specie

Item I Bequeath to my son Thomas Shambles Bradbury fifty Pounds
specie, and to each of said Shambles children I give fifty pounds
like more

Item. I give to my daughter Rhoda Standly a parcel of 2
Lying on the main road between my house and
Falling Creek. Containing 500 Acres, during her
life and after her decease, I give the said lands
to her eldest son James Standly to him & his heirs
for ever, also I give my daughter Rhoda Two
negroes, Vizt. Titus & Linda, Likewise one large
Bible, & one pray book and after the decease
of the said Rhoda to be given to her son Jackson
and his heirs for ever

Item I Bequeath to my Grand Son James Bradbury
my Plantation, whereon I now live Containing
300 Acres to him and to his heirs for ever, I also
give ^{him} a negro slave named (Boon)

Item I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Gran-
tham Twenty five pounds specie

Item I give to my son in law Thomas Grantham one
single Shilling specie

Item I give to my Grandson James Bradbury Ritt
five pounds specie

Item I give the remainder part of my personal Estate
after the within Legacies is paid to be Equally
Divided between my Executors - - -
and lastly I do nominate and ordain Wills
McKinnie, Richard McKinnie, and Stephen Standly
Executors of this my last will and Testament, In
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
