saith that he was acquainted with  
Doctor Thomas Boykin late of said County deceased that  
the said Boykin departed this life in the month of April  
as well as he remembers and in the year 1701. that sometime before  
his death he made and executed his last will and Testament  
in due form in the presence of this deponent George Herring  
and Alice Jernigan who signed the same as witnesses  
that he this deponent John Handley and John Deloach  
were by the said Testator appointed Executors there unto and  
that the said Boykin did therein and thereby give to  
William Boykin his son the Land called his home plan-  
tation after the Testator's death or marriage of his  
the Testator's widow also five Negroes named Ned,  
Lamb. Nancy. Little Ned and Fan - also some  
Horses. Cows & Calves & pigs. and laundry other Articles  
which he doth not recollect - he further swears that  
the Testator did by the same will give to  
Polly Herring three negroes to wit, Chloe  
Peg & Sal, together with laundry other  
Articles, to Thomas Boykin four negroes  
to wit, Bob. Beck. Will & Dinah, & to John  
Boykin the son of the said Thomas one Negro  
named Sampson, also to Mr. said Thomas  
a plantation containing four hundred acres  
of Land to Beliah Handley Daughter of the Testator  
three negroes viz, Tom, Amy & Rose, - In Earth  
(Deloach another of his daughters three negroes to wit  
(Turn over)

with, Charly, Jimmy & Kate, and to Mary Boykin the widow  
 he gave three negroes to wit Dick Tab & Bob, the deponent  
 further says that the Testator by the said will gave to each  
 of the above named legatees sundry other articles  
 which he cannot now recollect, he further saith that the  
 aforesaid will of the Testator, <sup>was</sup> regularly proved in the  
 Court of Wayne that was held in April 1705. and that  
 he the deponent and John Handley Qualified thereto as  
 executors, he further saith that the aforesaid mentioned
