In the Name God Amen. I John Thompson of North Carolina Wayne being imperfect health pray god, become & make this my last will and Testament as Followeth in presence  
I leave to my loving wife Rachel Thompson ~~and~~ <sup>my son</sup> man named Quash and five and calves and three beef cattle and one horse known by the name of Frolic and one and Furniture and I lend my Wife in Manseer plantation During her Widowhood and also give to her twenty Head of hogs and seven Head of Sheep and all in these hold furniture I lend her During her Widowhood and all my Workin Tools During her Widowhood Him I give to my Son Tho: Thompson five shilling Harling Him I give to my loving Daughter - Mary Gracost five shillings Harling Him I give to my loving Son John Thom one negro Boy named Simon Him I give to my loving Son William Thompson one hundred Inventory acres of land which he has My soon John shall pay my Daughter Sarah ~~the~~ <sup>Twelve</sup> pounds -

Also one negro Boy to my Son William name Sam  
he paying my Daughter Martha Twelve pound  
Him I give my loving son James Thompson one  
Thousand and Twenty acres of land where he  
lives and one negro Boy named Bob and my  
plantation where I live after my Wifes  
Decease or Mischance Him I give to my loving  
Daughter ann one negro Woman named  
Ramus and one Tutta Bed and Furniture  
Him I give to my loving son Simeon Thompson  
one negro Boy named Ben Him I give my son  
Joshua Thompson and Peter Thompson all my  
Stock of all kinds to be Equally Divided  
Between them Both that is not given away  
Before and all my Estate that I have lent  
to my Wife to be Divided Between Joshua and  
Peter Him I give to my grand son Isaac  
Thompson one Linenys in gold and I leave  
Thomas Sampson & John Thompson &  
James Thompson Executors of this my last  
Will and Testament and Trustees of my wife  
and Children In witness where of I have sent  
set my hand and seal this 3<sup>th</sup> day of November in  
year of our Lord 1704
