January 1770. I, Richard Hart of the State of North
Carolina and County of Wayne being in Health and of
perfect mind and Memory thanke be to God for the
same, therefore calling to mind, and knowing that it
is appointed for all Men once to die, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament (Viz)
Principally and first of all, I give and recommend
my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and
my Body I recommend to the Earth, to be Buried
in a Christian like and decent manner, at the
Discretion of my Executors; nothing doubting
but I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God, and as for what worldly
Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with
in this life, I give and dispose of in the following
manner (to Wit) I give and bequeath to my well beloved
Wife Eliza Hart, Two Feather Beds, One Iron Bed,
One Traying Pan, One small Pewter Basin, One Plate
One Chest, One Linnen Wheel Two Pewter Plates
One Dish, One Wool Wheel, One pair Cotton Charts,
The Third part of my Stock of Cattle, The Third
part of my Sheep half of my Hogs, Half of my Bush
of Corn, Wheat, Cotton, Flax &c.

I then give and bequeath to my well beloved son George Miller Hart, my Riding Brass, Brace and Saddle, all my working Tools of all kinds, Six Head of Cattle, delivered him some time past, and the Remainder of my Cattle after my Wife has her Share also the Remainder of my Sheep after my Wife's - her Hogs and half my Hogs. two Cowen Broom, and one black one white Cow, one large Iron Pot, one pair of Iron Tonges, and one Case of Pruning and Forks, and one Spind - Stone. And I hereby constitute, and Appoint my Wife (Joia Hart, and Joel Herring Executors of this my last Will and Testament, utterly disannulling and Re-voaking all other and former Wills by me made & acknowledging this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and Year above Written.
