Governor of said State in the first and full term of one thousand pounds & more to be paid to the said R. B. Spaight Esq. Governor and his successours or assigns to which payment we will and truly do make within our term our lives & executors Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and Dated the 23rd day of November Anno Domini 1794

The condition of the above obligation. Such that if the above bound Patrick Hamrick Administrators of J. P. Smith Decedent do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods and Chattels rights and Credits of the Decedent and of any other person or persons for him and the same to be taken and certified into the Secretarys office and one attested copy thereof to be exhibited in the County Court of Watauga for Administration to be paid within forty days after the Date of these presents and the same goods Chattels and Credits and all other goods Chattels and Credits of the Decedent at the time of Death which at any time hereafter shall come into the hands or possession of the said Patrick Hamrick or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him or same to be made a true and just account of his said Administration within one year after the date of these presents And all the said and Residue of the said goods and Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration except the same being first examined and allowed by the Governor or General or County Court shall Deliver or pay to such person or persons and respectively as the same shall be due pursuant to the true intent and meaning of Act in that case made and provided and if it shall appear that any will or testimony was made by the decedent and the Executors or Administrators named do exhibit the same said Court no being equal to have it allowed and approved of according to the said Act and the above bound being thereunto required do render and deliver the letters of Administration approbation of such the same being had and made in said Court: Then this obligation to be void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue
