My Charles Gordon's Will April Term 1799 214

In the name of God Amen. I Charles Gordon of the County North Carolina being of legal age and sound memory, and willing to make this voluntarily of legal mind that full and entire test, do make and create this my last will and testament in manner and form following

Item. I do give unto my beloved wife Mary Gordon, the one of all my estate both real and personal during her natural life or widowhood, or until my daughter Nancy B. Gordon or my daughter Betty Bassell Gordon shall arrive to the age of twenty one year or marry And if she the said Mary Gordon should marry before either of my two daughters aforesaid shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one year then the whole estate to be equally divided between her the said Mary Gordon and my daughter Nancy Bassell Gordon and my daughter Betty Bassell Gordon, and the division of her the said Mary Gordon being one third part of the whole estate to remain in her possession during her natural life, and then to be equally divided between my said two daughters Nancy B. Gordon and Betty B. Gordon.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy B. Gordon one third part of all my estate both real and personal to be delivered to her by my executors when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one year.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Bassell Gordon one third part of all my estate both real and personal to be delivered to her by my executors when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one year - Provided nevertheless that if either of my two daughters above mentioned should die before they marry or arrive to the age of twenty one year the survivor to have the whole of the third part hereby intended to be given to such daughter that shall so survive - One half of which to be delivered to said survivor when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one year and the other half at the death of her mother Mary Gordon. Lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Mary Gordon executrix and my trusty friend William Bassell Leases Executor of this my last will and testament.
