Indenture Binding James Rowe & Edmund Denney

This Indenture made the Twentieth Day of August the  
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine Between  
Edmund Denney of the County of North Carolina  
of the one part and James Rowe of the County and State and Province  
of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Rowe for  
and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five pounds Sterling Shilling  
Bank Money Paid unto him the said James Rowe for the further  
consideration that he the said Edmund Denney find him the said James  
in Laying & Diet for and During the Term of Twelve years here-  
said he the said James Rowe doth Covenant & agree with him  
the said Edmund Denney that he the said James will serve  
him the said Edmund Denney for and During the Term aforesaid as  
a faithful and true servant and that he will at all times obey every  
legal Command of him the said Edmund Denney and will not  
at any time absent himself from the said Edmund Denney without  
at first Obtaining the Permission of the said Edmund Denney and  
During the Term aforesaid will in all things demean himself  
as a true and faithful servant. In Witness Whereof the said
