the Directions of the said Justices in that Case made and  
Provided Doth full place and Kind unto the said Nathaniel Gordon  
an African Boy Named Samson A man now about 18 years to  
earn the Proportion of a Black Smith & to Read Books & Cylphes  
with the said Nathaniel Gordon to live after the manner of an  
Apprentice and Servant until the said African shall attain  
to the Age of Twenty One years During all that time the said  
Apprentice his Master shall faithfully serve his said  
Master and every other Master he shall have at any time about  
himself from his said Master Service without Reward But in all  
Things as a good and vertuous Servant shall Behave towards his said  
Master and the said Nathaniel Gordon Both Courteously promise  
and agree to and with the said Charles Gordon that he the said  
Nathaniel Gordon will constantly find and provide for the said  
Apprentice During the time aforesaid Sufficient Dut<sup>r</sup> Washing  
and Lodging fitting for an Apprentice also all Other Things  
Necessary both in Cloathes and in Health In witness whereof the  
Parties have Interchangably set their hands and sealed this day and  
year past above written —

Last Will and Testament of John Coffey Deceased Augt 21<sup>st</sup> 1789

In the Name of God Amen I John Coffey of N<sup>r</sup> Carolina and  
County of Pitts<sup>r</sup> the weak in Body yet perfect in mind and memory  
Constitute this my last will and Testament I Give my soul  
to God my Redemer and my Body to Burial in a decent  
manner and after my just Debts are paid I Despose of my  
Hiddly Goods as follow to wit I Give to my Wife Mrs the  
Plantation wherein I now live and all my Household ha-  
ndments and two Negroe namely Harry & Pig and all my  
Stock of Horses Cattle Sheep & Hogs Ensuring her Dute  
and lief in Mortuorh I Also will that as much of my Land  
be sold by my Executor or pay my Debts the Remainder of  
my Land to be Equally Divided among my Sons Cleveland  
James, Jos<sup>t</sup>, Nathan and the Rest of my Digeus to be  
equally Divided among my Children to wit Cleveland  
James, Jos<sup>t</sup>, Nathan, Esty, Jane & Sally and if my wife is  
at present with Child for it if it lives to Share an equal part  
with the Rest and at the Death or Marriage of my wife for  
what I leave to her to be Equally Divided among all my  
Children my present Estate to be Improved and kept  
together till my Youngest Child come of Age & Harry  
Kibazander Coffey and my son Cleveland Coffey Executor  
I Despose of this my last will and Testament made this  
27<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1789 —
