John Cook's Last Will and Testament Oct. Term 1785

In the Name of God Amen I John Cook of the County of Wilkes State of North Carolina being Perfect in Body mind & memory, I give my voice to God my Redeemer and my Body to be buried in a decent manner, first I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth all my movable Effects being her widow's share in the Plantation whereon I now live and after her decease the movable Effects therein being to be equally divided amongst those my Children as follows to wit Anne Sarah Elizabeth & Isaac I also give to my son Isaac the tract of land whereon I now live to be divided between them to wit to Anne the lower end next to the mill & to Sarah the upper & next to the mountain as already divided by line I also give to my son Isaac the tract of land lying on the Mountain known by the name of Chestnut neck to be divided as they shall see cause. I also give to my son John widow the Particular Articles she is now possessed with that she hath received of me my wife Elizabeth & John Barton Executors I acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have signed this with my hand of this 10th day of April Anno Dom: One thousand seven hundred & Eighty Two
