all of the County of Wilkes and State of North Carolina
are held and firmly bound unto Alexander Martin Esq^r
governor &c in the full sum of two thousand pounds current
money of said State to be paid to the said Alexander Martin
gov^r and his Successors in Office to which payment
will and truly to be made we bind Ourselves Our Heirs Executors and
Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents pa-
id with our seals and Dated this 27th day of October A.D. 1791

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above
bound Lewis Demps was duly appointed Sheriff for Anne Domine
1791 for the County of Wilkes aforesaid, and it being the Duty of him
the said Lewis Demps by virtue of said appointment to col-
lect and settle with the publick Treasurer for the taxes &c.
therefore it he the said Lewis Demps hath duly collected from
the several Collectors in the county of Wilkes aforesaid that
were appointed by the Court for the purpose of collecting the
publick Taxes in said County for the year of our Lord one thou-
sand seven hundred and Ninety one and well and truly account
for and pay the same to the publick Treasurer in such
manner as the Law Directs Then the above Obligation to be
void otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue

The last Will & Testament of John Parker Esq^r October 26th 1791

State of North Carolina } In the Name of God Amen I John
Wilkes County } Parker of State and County aforesaid
said The weak in Body yet perfect in mind and memory
give my soul to god my Creator and my body to be buried
in a decent manner and after my lawfull Debts are
paid I will that my worldly Estates be disposed of as fol-
lows (To wit) I give to my well beloved Wife Mary an un-
tainted possession of the Tract of Land whereon I now live and
all my Stock of Different kinds and Household furniture
concerning her Natural life or Widowhood and after her Deat-
h and Marriage for the said to go to my son James and I give
to my first Daughter Mary an equal a land and half to be
given her at her Marriage or her Mothers death The Rest to be
Equally divided among my four Children to wit John William
James and Diana and a further Share given to my son John
a certain tract of Land beginning and ending with the corner
to my son William a house creature to half the value of £100
I acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament witness
by my hand this 17th Day of Octo^r 1791 I appoint my wife
Mary and son John my Executor
