And if the said John Stampers dies without a lawful issue of his body my will and desire is that his estate be brought in and equally divided amongst his brother and sister and after my wifes life or widowhood my will and desire is that the rest of my estate be equally divided amongst the rest of my children by will and desire is that the negro man not be sold out of the family. Given from under my hand sealed with seal and dated the twentieth day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety three

May Charles Gordon's Will April Term 1799 (314)

In the name of God almighty I Charles Gordon of this County North Carolina being of sound mind and memory and willing to make my last will do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following Item. I first make my beloved wife Mary Gordon, the next of all my estate both real and personal during her natural life or understanding, or until my daughter Nancy Bell Gorden or my daughter Betsey Bassett Gorden shall arrive to the age of twenty one years or more And if she the said Mary Gordon should marry before either of my two daughters aforesaid shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one years then the whole estate to be equally divided between her the said Mary Gordon and my daughter Nancy Bell Gorden and my daughter Betsey Bassett Gorden, and the division of the said estate Mary Gordon being one third part of the whole estate to remain in her possession during her natural life and then to be equally divided between my said two daughters Nancy B. Gordon and Betsey B. Gordon Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy B. Gordon one third part of all my estate both real and personal to be delivered to her by my executors when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one years Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsey Bassett Gorden one third part of all my estate both real and personal to be delivered to her by my executors when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one years - Provided always that if either of my two daughters above mentioned should die before they marry or arrive to the age of twenty one years the surviving to have the whole of the third part thereby intended to be given to such daughter that shall remain - One half of which to be divided to said survivor when she shall marry or arrive to the age of twenty one years and the other half at the death of her mother Mary Gordon. Lastly I here nominate and appoint my wife Mary Gordon Executrix of my trusty friend William Galters Lawyer Executor of this my last will and testament In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal the 6th day of May 1799 - Charles Gordon (ratified and published April 1799) - Paid for by John Gilby from me for Linen sum in Robins being of the value of £100 00
