

A. Harrison's Will

The last will and testament of A. Harrison
I, A. Harrison being of sound mind and deposing memory, do make, publish and declare the following to be my last will and testament to wit:

- Item First - After the payment of my debts and burial expenses I will, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza Harrison all of my personal property of every kind and description.
- Item Second - I will, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza Harrison all my real estate of every kind and description to have and to hold the same during her natural life.
- Item Third - After the death of my wife Eliza Harrison I will, devise and bequeath to my son John W. Harrison and his heirs the house and lot on which I now live in the town of Yadkinville adjoining the lot of B.B. Harrell on the East and T.C. Phillips on the South, J.M. Phillips on the West and the street on the North.
- Item Fourth - After the death of my wife Eliza Harrison I will, devise and bequeath to my son John W. Harrison and my daughter Mary A. Whitaker and their heirs all of my real estate not hereinbefore disposed of including my two town lots in Yadkinville being lots nos. 55 & 56 in the original plat of said town, to be equally divided between them, share and share alike.
- Item Fifth - I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Eliza Harrison executrix to execute and carry out this my last will and testament.
