I Avariah Horn of the State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of my earthly existence do hereby make and declare my last Will and Testament in the following terms to wit: I give & bequeath to my Daughter J. M. Huff or her bodily heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining J. H. Norman & others & known as lot no. 1 in the Division of my land containing 21 aced. I give & bequeath to my son H. Horn or his heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining the lands of R. E. Patton & others & known as lot no. 2 in the Division containing 4 1/2 aced. Thirdly I give & bequeath to my Daughter Nellie A. Smithman or her bodily heirs (Wife of J. A. Smithman) a certain piece or parcel of land adjoining the lands of the M. E. Church & known as lot no. 3 in the Division containing Eight aced. Fourthly I give & bequeath to my son Robert B. Horn or his heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining the lands of J. H. Norman & others & known as lot no. 4 containing 11 3/4 aced. Fifthly I give & bequeath to my son R. D. Ballin Horn or his heirs a certain piece or lot of land adjoining the lands of James Martin & others & known as lot no. 5 in the Division containing 18 aced. Next 2' N. 5' Ch. 140 lines to a stone then still West 5' Ch. 20
to black thump old corner then Northward 2' Ch. 4' Ch. com
then Eastward 75 lines to second corner at the branch
then down the branch N. about 10' Next 9' Ch. 20 a pile
of stones on the East side of the branch. Nonnans
Corner. Then East 4' S. 6' Ch. 123 lines to a stone at the end
then Southward with the road 9' Ch. 36 lines to the beg.
Containing six acres more or less.

Sixthly I do hereby advise my Executors to select three
disinterested men to value the said lots of land
and each of my several heirs to be charged with the
said valuation in the settlement of my
Estate.

Seventh I do further say & declare the remainder of
my real estate at my death shall be sold after adjusting as the
law directs at my residence for cash in hand.

Eighth I do further advise that my store house lot be
equally divided among parcel with East Street before
said sale to be sold separat & as a whole lot and whichever
sale brings the most shall as may be confirmed.

Ninth I do further declare that all my personal
property shall be sold at public auction for cash after
being advertised as the law directs.

Tenth I do further declare that my Executors shall
pay all just claims or debts that may occur at my death
and that all the proceeds of my estate both real & personal
that remain after the commission & said expenses
are paid shall be equally divided among my foregoing
named heirs.

Eleventh I do hereby appoint my son N. H. Horn
as my lawful executor to execute the purposes &
contents of this my last will and Testament in
manner & form as directed by me
Signed sealed and delivered in the presence
of three my witnesses as my last will and
