7<sup>th</sup> I give and devise the remainder of my estate both real and personal, to my four sons B. C. C. J. J. W. and W. S. Matthews equally. Charging on B. C. Matthews part a certain note dated Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 1915, for \$20.00 and a certain amt. of interest from date until my death,

8<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint my sons J. W. and C. J. Matthews my lawful executors to all intents and purposes to execute my last will and Testament according to the true intent & meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring
