First: 1st I will and direct my Executors here

 enough of the personal property into
 money to pay off all the debts, dues and liab-
 ilities that may be existing against me at
 the time of my decease, also my funeral
 and burial expences, and collect all dues and
 debts that may be due me at the time of my
 decease. Second 2nd. I will and direct my
 Executors to appropriate enough of the money
 remaining to erect, and complete a nice
 comfortable four room Cottage resident
 dwelling for my beloved widowed wife
 (Mrs Ellen Daub) and children to be erected on
 my real estate.

Third 3rd I will and bequeath the rest, residue

and remainder of my estate both real and personal
 of whatever name and nature it may come to the
 use and benefit of my beloved wife and children
 during her widowhood.

Fourth 4th I will and bequeath at the end of widowhood
 of my beloved widowed wife, the whole of my estate
 both real and personal of whatever name and nature
 it may come, that remains to be equally divided
 in fee simple between my children, share and
 share alike. Fifth 5th I will and direct that
 my Executors sell either private or public any
 personal property that is deemed unnecessary to
 hold. Sixth 6th. I further will and direct that
 my Executors especially proceed as soon as
 practicable, to dispose of all my Bank Stock, either
 by private or public sale, and apply the proceeds
 as herein before directed for other purposes.

Seventh 7th and last. I hereby nominate, constitute and
 appoint Mrs Georgia Ellen Daub, John W. Daub
 and J. L. Daub Executors of this my last will

W. D. Steele Will

North Carolina, Yadkin County.

In the name of God, Amen;

I, W. D. Steele, being of sound mind and memory, but knowing the uncertainty of life, do make this my last will and testament:

Item 1. I will that at my death my body be given a decent burial.

Item 2. After my death it is my will that my wife, Frances Steele, have a life estate in one third of all my real estate, the same to be selected by her and assigned her in value by proceedings in laying off dower unless she and the remaindermen or his representatives agree as to the extent of said one third interest in which event no appraisal is necessary; and after her death I give all my real estate in fee simple to my friend John T. Benbow. My real estate consists of the home place in the town of East Bend where I now live, lying on the North side of the road leading to Dornaha, N.C. containing about two and one half acres, and a tract adjoining the lands of Julius Long and others in East Bend Township containing originally about fifty acres, but now about thirty six and four tenths acres lying on the west side of the public road leading from East Bend to the
