First: 1st I will and direct my Executors hereinafter named to take possession of my estate, both real and personal and convert enough of the personal property into money to pay off all the debts, dues and liabilities that may be existing against me at the time of my decease, also my funeral and burial expenses, and collect all dues and debts that may be due me at the time of my decease. Second 2nd I will and direct my Executors to appropriate enough of the money remaining to erect and complete a nice comfortable four room Cottage residence dwelling for my beloved widowed wife (Mrs Ellen Daub) and Children to be erected on my real estate.

Third 3rd I will and bequeath the rest, residues

Fourth 4th I will and bequeath at the end of widowhood of my beloved widowed wife, the whole of my estate both real and personal of whatever name and nature it may consist, that remains to be equally divided in fee simple between my children, share and share alike. Fifth 5th I will and direct that my Executors sell either private or public any personal property that is deemed unnecessary to hold. Sixth 6th I further will and direct that my Executors especially proceed as soon as practicable, to dispose of all my Bank Stock, either by private or public sale and apply the proceeds as herein before directed for other purposes.
