B. B. Colvard's Will

I, B. B. Colvard, of the County of Yadkin and State of N. C. being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:

First,

That my Executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay funeral expenses, together with my just debts, however and to whomsoever owing, out of the monies that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item 1st

I give and devise to my wife thirty five acres of land out of the May tract, bounded as follows, commencing in the Carter line, North West of house I now live in, runs South on the Smith & May, to a due East line sixty yards, North of the May Spring, then East along said line far enough to include the remainder of the Stinson lot or orchard, thence South to the North bank of South Deep Creek, thence down said creek as it meanders so as to include one third of the May bottom land, thence North to the goose pond branch, up said branch as it meanders to the fork, then up the spring branch to living poplars to a stone in said branch, thence West 1/2 chain, thence North to Wm Sherrers line, thence West along said line to mine & C. L. Sherrers corner, near my large tobacco barn, thence North along C. L. Sherrers & B. B. Colvard's line to the old Carter line, thence West along said line to the beginning. And also, a child's part of sixty six acres to be laid off so as to include my mills & all water powers. Said tract to be laid off as near square as practicable, and also to have timber from the factory lands or the Pindexter land for building purposes.

Item 2nd

The remainder of my lands, not specified in the above, to be equally divided among my children and also all my personal property to be equally divided among my children.

Item 3rd

The road that now runs from William Sherrers line, to Perry Sherrers line, along the foot of the hills on the North side of the bottom to be kept open for the benefit of all parties owning said lands.

Item 4th

I charge my son John B. Colvard with five hundred dollars free of interest it being fifty acres of the factory tract.

Item 5th

I charge my son James A. Colvard with four hundred

eighty-seven dollars and fifty cts. Subject to a small credit free of interest it being a part of the factory lands. The amount charged against John H. Colvard & James A. Colvard to be taken out of their part of my estate. I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons J. H. Colvard, John H. Colvard, H. L. Colvard, B. B. Colvard my lawful executors to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
