Cook my lawful executor to see intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof. I hereby revoke and declare utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made or witnessed whereof I the said D.C. Myers do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 5th day of August A.D. 1911.
