 (Fifth) I give and bequeath unto Coma
 M. Parham five Dollars in money

(Sixth) It is my will that all my property be sold
 that can be divided, satisfactory among my
 living children all the money I have on hand
 & can be collected from any source, to be equally
 divided among my living children.
 (Seventh) I hereby constitute and appoint my
 son Harvey H. Huff my lawful Executor, to
 this my last will.
