I E.C. Mayberry of the aforesaid County and State being of sound mind and desirous of memory, but Considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make publish and declare this my last will and testament:

First: I will that all of my just debts including my funeral expenses, be paid out of the first monies coming into the hands of my executor belonging to my estate.

Second: I will and bequeath to my beloved father G.W. Mayberry all of my interest in the farming tools, live stock, and other property in which he now has an undivided interest. Also an automobile and all of my household property which is now in his possession, and also all of my rents from crops now growing on my lands.

Third: I will and devise to my beloved sister AJ Myers the sum of One Thousand Dollars to be held by her in trust and to be used by her in equal amounts, in the education of my three nephews Carl Myers, Charlie Myers and Lebam Myers, and my niece Hattie Myers.

Fourth: I will and devise to my beloved sister AJ Myers all of the remainder of my property, both real and personal, to belong to her absolutely in fee simple.

Fifth: I constatute and appoint my beloved

sister AJ Myers my lawful executrix etc. intants and personal to execute the provisions of this my last will and testament, and to surely settle and distribute same and void all other entries thereto before made by me.
