My will is that all my just debts and

after my decease as shall by them be found convenient

Then I give devise and bequeath to my beloved

as long as she remains my widow and also with the
following personal property to wit: one new and all
kitchen utensils, one dark colored dresser, one

bed, head stead and spring mattress & quilted

quilted spider cover. I will that she shall have

United place one hundred dollars in cash to be
