I Elizabeth Pauls Glen of the County of Yaddow and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say that I give and bequeath to my Grand Son William R. Tragers the sum of five dollars. And further that I give to my fair children who are still living named as follows to wit Agnes Ann Brown, Margaret C. Hunter, Alice Elizabeth Glen, John T. Glen, each an equal share in my remaining property both Personal and Real Estate. And further my Will is that my land to wit a tract that Margaret C. Hunter shall have her share, as let where she now lives, and further that Alice Elizabeth Glen shall have my Home House where I now live allotted to her. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my truly friend W.D. Williams my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same. I do witness whereof I the said Elizabeth Pauls Glen do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 5th day of June 1895.

And the deponent further saith, that the said Elizabeth Pauls Glen the testator aforesaid, did at the time of subscribing her name as aforesaid, declare the said paper writing as subscribed by her, and exhibited, to be her last will and testament, and this deponent did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will, as an attesting witness thereto and at the request, and in the presence of said testator. And this deponent further saith, that at the said time when the said testator subscribed her name to the said last will as aforesaid, and at the time of the deponent subscribing his name as an attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Elizabeth Pauls Glen was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a will, and was not under any restraint to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent, and further these deponents say not.
