I Elizabeth Cross of Yadkin County do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament in substance as follows:

I will and bequeath to my Daughters Etter Wooten one Straw tick, one Cotton bed, three feather pillows, four new quilts, one under sheet, one top sheet, one pot and hooks and pot lid, one Showcase safe, five plates, three dishes, three knives and three forks three spoons. I will and bequeath to my Daughters Clementine Reece, one feather bed and two feather pillows, two straw pillows five quilts, three County pins or sheets. I will to my two Daughters Etter Wooten and Clementine Reece all the money that I may have on hand at my death to be divided Equal between them, one house and one and one half acre of land to be divided Equally between them by sale or divide between them.

I appoint as executor to this my last will and testament I L. Halcomb. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal.
